WEB PAGES AND ARTICLES ON THE INTERNET

Author(s) (if available). "Article Title." *Name of web site*. Date on website (if available). Day Month Year of Site Visit <electronic address>.

Article on a website, with no author, with date of posting

CITING SOURCES IN THE TEXT

Besides a **Works Cited** list, you must indicate the source of the **words**, **facts**, **or ideas** that you researched. The most practical way to supply this information is to embed the citation in the text in parentheses().

- ✓ Give the author's last name (or the title of the work) and the page number(s) in parentheses.
- ✓ Provide the full citation information in your **Works Cited** list
- ✓ Provide citation information when you use **quotations**, **paraphrases**, or when you summarize
- ✓ If the same information can be found in at least five sources, it is considered common knowledge and you do not need to cite the information.

General Rules:

- Italicize the title of *books* (use the same format in your **Works Cited** list).
- Put quotation marks around the title of "articles" (magazine, encyclopedia, web site)
- Do not put commas between the author and page number
- If your parenthetical reference is at the end of a sentence, place the period after the parentheses (instead of the end of quote or paraphrase)

How to CITE:

- (Author's last name page number) (Jones 54)
- If there is no author, put the title in parenthesis with page number ("Frank, Anne" 34)
- If there is no page number, as from the Internet, only use the author or title in the citation ("Frank, Anne") or (Jones)

Example 1: direct quotation from one author from a book

The author gives us an image of strength and cold, "Above the town, on the hill brow, the stone angel used to stand" (Laurence 3).

Example 2: an article from the Internet, with no author or page numbers - paraphrased

Pharoahs were considered gods and they had a task to lead people ("Egypt").
